Woodson Projects Under Construction

This spring, Woodson is managing over \$4 Million of construction projects. These include Grand Canyon Boulevard for the City of Williams, the Ellen Waterline for the City of Williams, Foxtrot Power System Improvements for Camp Navajo, Renaissance on Route 66 - Phase 6 for the City of Winslow and the Apache Sewer Bypass for the City of Winslow.

The Apache Sewer Bypass provides the City of Winslow with increased sewer capacity for the future. A key component of this project is boring a 48-inch sleeve under Interstate 40 for a new line that must have a slope of only .09% (see adjacent photo).

One of Woodson's earliest contracts was with the City of Winslow as the contract City Engineer - a role we continue to fill to this day. Our 24-year history in Winslow has resulted in hundreds of projects. Perhaps the most visible was the revitalization of the historic downtown area. We recently opened bids on Phase 6 of this series of projects know as **Renaissance on Route 66.**

This redevelopment project has spanned over 20 years with over \$20

Million of improvements for the City. Woodson has managed this multi-jurisdictional project since inception. We have provided master planning, phasing, engineering and construction administration services. Renaissance on Route 66 Phase 2 featured the Standin' on the Corner Park. This site averages 100,000 visitors every year. The project was awarded the APWA Public Works Project of the Year in Historical Renovation/Preservation. ♦
